The purpose of the technical meeting is to discuss issues surrounding racing, development of the sport of outrigger, promoting and facilitating both individual and club members and to allow input from members into the operational aspect of CORA's mandate. It is not a substitution for the AGM although some line items will have overlap with AGM topics.

2. 2018 Race review and scheduling of 2019 events

- 2.1. Don gave a review of the 2018 race season highlights and participation. 21 of 27 CORA clubs participated in a CORA sanctioned race this past year. CORA members were invited to offer some feedback about the races. There was some discussion about race placement recognition, prizes, food, etc. differing in standards race to race. It was also noted that the race schedule was very crowded. Rob gave an overview of the framework for minimal standards for hosting a race.

- 2.2. Race sanctioning forms are now submitted on automated digital form. (Communications team to add V12 dropdown.)
- 2.3. Proposed 2018 race schedule (attached below minutes) was reviewed to check for conflicts or questions (e.g., confirmation for format, distance and CORA Cup status). Draft schedule will be updated by Communications team on the website and is subject to change: <https://www.canadianoutrigger.com/races/schedule/>
 - 2.3.1. Erik will change March Madness to show as taking place Mar 30 and 31 and add a note for club reps requesting CORA Cup status.
 - 2.3.2. Marianne will connect with VCKC to get them to work with Erik to change Wake Up the Gorge to Apr 5-6, instead of Apr 26-27
 - 2.3.3. VYPC has applied for the Nationals race on Apr 27-28 to be recognized as CORA Cup Sprints. There was discussion that a Nationals ought to take place when all Canadians are on the water. The challenge is that the distance races make for an already full calendar from spring to fall, and there were not other applications. Rob recommended a committee is established to further discuss these ideas. Leduc mentioned interest in putting together an application to host Nationals Sprints in another region. As 2019 applications for this year have already been collected, it might be best for Leduc to propose a race for 2020.
 - 2.3.4. Duel in the Desert has applied for CORA Cup status for the BC Interior race. Approved, no competing applications.
 - 2.3.5. Duel and Switchblade are both proposed for May 11, but are likely not to attract the same participants, so both races are accepted onto the calendar as submitted.
 - 2.3.6. FLCC River Run and Jericho are both proposed for May 25. Jericho is usually held on this weekend historically, and the date fits in with the Sailing Centre schedule. Jericho really wants the date and is less interested in CORA Cup status than the date. FLCC chose this date due to tides, melt and how it affects the river. CORA members have an appetite for new races. Moving one of the races to the next weekend means there will be three race weekends in a row (Jericho, River Run and Island Iron). FLCC agreed to move their event to April 20th though Graeme mentioned this will conflict with Easter weekend for some paddlers. FLCC will be a CORA Cup race and Jericho will recuse themselves from being considered for a CORA Cup race.
 - 2.3.7. It was proposed that CORA set the Nationals date first, then offer clubs a set list of potential CORA Cup weekends for which they can apply to have their race as a CORA Cup race.
 - 2.3.8. Jul 20 VOS made a manual entry of a race application for a Chase-down race.
 - 2.3.9. Distance was not included in all race applications and Erik is following up so that there can be a complete listing posted on the CORA website calendar.
 - 2.3.10. Around Bowed Island and Island Changes are both proposed for Jul 27. Island Changes may offer a dry change option to increase participation. The date conflict, should both races be held on the same date, might hurt Island Changes more. The races may attract different kinds of paddlers for each one. It was recommended that CORA should sanction both races, and motion carried.
 - 2.3.11. Regarding date conflicts, it was proposed that for next year the proposed races and their proposed dates are made visible to race host clubs so that they can begin to mitigate ahead of time. It would also be helpful for club representatives to be

present at the Technical meeting to offer their rationale for selecting certain dates so that conflicts could be worked out at this meeting in person, if not ahead of time.

2.3.12. Races proposed for Sep 21: Classique d'Automne in Montreal (pending COMMOC becoming a CORA member), Nationals Battleship Iron in Port Alberni, and Lotus Poker Paddle in Burnaby. The Montreal race will not compete for attendance with the other races. It is thought the other two will also not be in competition for attendance by the same group of paddlers and should both be sanctioned without working to alter dates.

2.3.13. Regarding CORA Cup Nationals (distance), both applications (Harrison Lake and Port Alberni) are from communities located on a lake rather than an ocean. Offering Nationals in Harrison makes it logistically easier for clubs to the east of lower mainland to attend. Harrison conflicts with Victoria Dragon boat Festival. Harrison was approved to host Nationals.

3. **CORA race sanctioning automated application forms**

3.1. Erik and Paul will work on a way to offer the CORA community visibility to the race applications received for the year after the present one.

For RME Open Call: the 4 clubs selected to receive remaining 2018 grant money were selected using criteria that considered how often over the past 5 years they had received RME grants or RME open calls, how to help newly established clubs get started, how to support equipment shared by multiple clubs, prioritizing repair over maintenance to get paddlers back on the water, supporting expenses that have already been paid for versus charges anticipated for future (which can apply for RME grants in 2 months <Jan>, etc.).

- 6.3.1. The Comm team is aiming to be more pro-active in communicating with the CORA membership.
- 6.3.2. There are discussions underway about how to make the membership database live to club contacts. New database will need to force CORA individual members choose a club and age range.
- 6.3.3. It is proposed that race directors will have an online form on which to enter their race results.
- 6.3.4. There is an appetite for the CORA Home page to have new content (e.g., race promotion) refreshed on a more regular schedule.
- 6.4. Conflict of interest guidelines for CORA Board members
 - 6.4.1. Ron and Jill completed the conflict of interest guidelines for CORA Board members and committee members to read, sign and subscribe to. Almost every Board and CORA committee member has signed the document, with a goal of 100% compliance by Dec 31, 2018.
- 6.5. CORA Board position descriptions
 - 6.5.1. Jill and Nicole are updating and supplementing information available on the CORA website so that the membership will have greater awareness of what the CORA positions involve and what they contribute to the organization and community. It is hoped this will attract more involvement from volunteers and nominated directors.
- 6.6. New initiatives, discussions, issues or concerns initiated by the members
 - 6.6.1. Leduc had a question about how clubs can get a copy of their CORA Club individual members that have registered for the year? At this point a direct request would go to Jan Chaverie. It is a manual process and clubs are asked not to request this list more than once a month.
 - 6.6.2. CORA was asked if the organization is interested in buying a trailer available to its membership to bring outrigger canoes to paddling events. There is a trailer shortage.
 - 6.6.2.1. CORA is interested, but it does bring about many logistical and expense considerations.
 - 6.6.2.2. Clubs are encouraged to pool their resources to coordinate shared trailers, borrow/lend them, etc.
 - 6.6.2.3. Another idea was to offer a CORA grant to clubs to purchase a trailer. (The grant money from an existing grant budget can be reallocated to this new grant.) Trailers can cost 10-15k, and some long-used trailers are not appropriate for carrying ultralights.
 - 6.6.2.4. Clubs were encouraged to use the CORA Message Board to coordinate canoe trailering amongst clubs.
 - 6.6.3. There is a great desire for more medals at CORA. However, many paddlers don't like medals. Some like consumables, other handy paddling paraphernalia, etc. CORA is attempting to share some recommended CORA Cup standards with race directors. There is a great desire for better race category recognition.
 - 6.6.4. Staggered starts for Ultralights versus other OC6s. A CORA Committee will be formed to brainstorm how to help with well communicated, clear directions and safety standards at the start line and on the race course.

2018 CORA AGM, IVF Director Report

2018 was the first year in which both Sprint and Long Distance IVF projects were ongoing simultaneously through the same calendar season.

IVF Sprint Project

The 2018 World Sprint Championships, held in Tahiti, were very successful for Canada. Team Canada was comprised of 55 paddlers representing age categories Open through 70's (no Juniors).

Medals won: 11

Elite Championships, Open Women V6 500m – Bronze

Club Championships;

Gold; 70's V1 Women, 70's Women 500m , 70's Men 500m Turn

Silver: 70's Women 500m turn, 70's Men 500m, 60's Women V6 1000m

Bronze: 70's Men V1, Open Women's V1, 60's Men V12 500m, 60's Women V6 500m

Notables: Canada had a strong support team with Lynda, Leanne and Kristine looking after various admin and coaching responsibilities. We were also fortunate to have massage therapists and a Chiro as paddling members. The coaching prior to and during the event was a great perk for paddlers as there is so much to learn during the event itself. Paddlers were able to improve their performance from heats to finals with the valuable feedback and support.

Selecting the crews earlier (September 2017) allowed for extra crew training over the winter and into the season. Crews took advantage of racing together at CORA events and additional training camps. I feel this resulted in a better performance for the crews, this was especially evident for the 60's and 70's women's crews, the Kelowna and Elite women and the 70's men. We feel this is a good format to carry forward, especially encouraging Club crews for 2020, allowing teams for more time to train and blend.

IVF Sprint project upcoming schedule:

2019 set up 'Intend to Compete' for May. Run selection sprint trials Fall 2019. Location TBD.

2020 World Sprints, Hilo Hawaii: August 15-23

We anticipate a large Team Canada 2020 with such a close location so this provides a great opportunity to work on coaching development and add extra sprint races and events to the CORA schedule.

2019 IVF Long Distance Project

2018 was a busy season running a total of 5 time trial/camps for interested paddlers. There were a total of 60 men and 52 women that registered to trial at one or more of the events. 78 paddlers were invited to attend the Round 2 camp in October as the final crew selection event. Trials for OC1 and V1 were held in addition to several sessions for all paddlers in V6 in which coaches observed blending and technical skills.

The Coaches Committee intends to have the first draft of Team Canada crews sent out to paddlers (pending Board approval) by November 9th.

Training camps for Team Canada 2019 TBD based on the CORA race schedule and other factors.
2019 World Distance Championships will be held in Mooloolaba, Australia August 9-16.
Admin and Coaching team TBD.

Thank you to the Coaches Committee members of Leanne Stanley, James Hill and Cindy Wright for their efforts at the training camps and the challenging task of selecting the Team. Leanne attended all trials and stepped up big time for the IVF committee.

It was great to see the support from the CORA Clubs in helping assist us with the trials. Extra kudo's to Fort Langley for hosting 2 trials, including the final round over 2 full days. Fantastic job of bringing in your paddlers to volunteer and run a great event (fog aside). As always, learning opportunities were presented to challenge us.

Financially, the IVF Budget is in good shape. The IVF projects receive a \$5k transfer from the CORA general account on an annual basis. In addition to funds earned through trial registrations we have funds to support paddlers with coaching clinics.

The IVF budget will be developed by the IVF committee in conjunction with the CORA Treasurer and amended as we work through the 2 IVF projects on an annual basis.
